Decision-making and management mechanisms of Chinese state-owned enterprises; 3. Innovation of ideas and leadership enhancement for senior executives of state-owned enterprises; 4. Institutional reform of state-owned enterprises; 5. The new ecosystem and new approaches for China's state-owned enterprise reform; 6. Experience and approaches of technology transfer and industry-academia-research integration of China's state-owned enterprises; 7. Introduction to the development of China's pilot free trade zones; 8. Strategic transformation of state-owned enterprises amid the transition from old to new growth drivers. This seminar will combine themed lectures with symposiums and site visits. Qingdao, the host city, is a major coastal hub in China and is specifically designated in the national social and economic development plan. It has successfully hosted some major international events and political and economic summits such as the sailing event of Beijing 2008 Olympics and</p>	

the SCO Qingdao Summit. During their stay in Qingdao, participants will visit exemplary enterprises in fields such as energy supply, intelligent manufacturing and port logistics for site visits. 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About the Co-Organizer	<p>The Academy for International Business Officials (AIBO) is an educational and training institution directly under the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China. Established in 1980, AIBO is located in Changping District, Beijing, about 30 kilometers from Beijing Capital International Airport. It boasts comprehensive infrastructure to provide services such as accommodation, catering, training and meetings for trainees.</p> <p>One of the main responsibilities of AIBO is to implement human resources development and cooperation projects, especially training courses for officials. The Academy serves as the main base for China's foreign aid training, offering both off-line and on-line training in China and overseas.</p> <p>Backed by the Ministry of Commerce and in close cooperation with China's top think tanks, research institutes and universities, AIBO brings together a large number of China's top experts and scholars to provide intellectual support for foreign aid training. It has developed a number of high-quality foreign aid training projects in the fields of trade and investment, international economic cooperation, governance and public management, which have proved to be fruitful.</p> <p>Since 1998, AIBO has successfully held over 2,000 training sessions for officials from developing countries (including 131 ministerial seminars), benefiting nearly 70,000 trainees from other developing countries around the world.</p> <p>National Medical Products Administration Institute of Executive Development (NMPAIED), established in 1984, is the only training institution affiliated to National Medical Products Administration (NMPA), the only postdoctoral research station within the drug regulation system with the main focus on social sciences research, and the only state-level drug safety emergency drill center. In 2011, the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Affairs approved the establishment of a national continuing education base for professional and technical personnel in NMPAIED. In 2015, the Ministry of Education approved the establishment of the Second National Steering Committee for Vocational Education in Food and Drugs, with the secretariat located in NMPAIED.</p> <p>The main responsibilities of NMPAIED include carrying out training for all levels and types of personnel from both drug regulation system and industry, conducting research on drug regulatory policies and theories, and organizing and guiding emergency drills and exercises in the fields of drugs, medical devices, cosmetics and food. As a national education and training institution, NMPAIED has constructed a comprehensive online and face-to face training system in the form of classroom lectures, on-site training, and scenario simulation, etc. It has taken the lead in designing and developing China's training system for professional inspectors of drugs, vaccines, medical devices, and cosmetics, as well as compiling supporting teaching materials; it has already formed a core faculty consisting of more than 130 people and a pool of nearly 2,000 teachers. On average, more than 300 face-to-face training courses of various types are held annually, with more than 66,000 trainees; the e-learning platform has a total of 757,000 registered trainees.</p> <p>NMPAIED, together with the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations</p>

Content

Background: Malaria remains a major public health problem threatening the health and socio-economic development of people in Africa, Southeast Asia and other regions. There is a sustained increase in demand for safe, effective and accessible artemisinin-based antimalarial drugs in the countries concerned, yet they continue to face practical challenges in terms of their industrial base, professional talent, quality control and regulatory capacity. Artemisinin is a significant innovation through which traditional Chinese medicine has contributed to the world. Artemisinin-based combination therapies remain a vital global strategy for malaria treatment today. Drawing on its experience in artemisinin drug R&D and application, mass prevention and treatment, and the "1-3-7" working norms, China received the World Health Organization's certification of malaria elimination in 2021. At present, China has established a relatively complete industrial chain covering Artemisia annua cultivation, artemisinin extraction, finished product manufacturing, quality control, international registration and supply assurance. Through platforms such as the National Medical Products Administration (NMPA), NMPAIED, the China Chamber of Commerce for Import and Export of Medicines and Health Products (CCCMHPIE) and the Artemisinin Industry Alliance, China has continuously advanced international cooperation on traditional Chinese medicine regulation and the international development of the artemisinin industry. Against this backdrop, holding the "International Workshop on Artemisinin-Based Drug Regulation and Industrial Development for Belt and Road Partner Countries" will help implement the relevant requirements of the Belt and Road Initiative and the building of a global community of health for all, share China's experience in drug regulation, artemisinin R&D and production, quality control and international cooperation, assist malaria-endemic countries in strengthening their self-sufficiency in antimalarial medicines, build a platform for regulatory and industrial cooperation and exchange between China and other countries, and help China's artemisinin industry and services better reach the international market.

Purpose: To actively implement the national Belt and Road Initiative and the vision of a global community of health for all; deepen cooperation between China and Belt and Road partner countries in artemisinin R&D, production, quality control and international registration, and explore the establishment of a long-term industrial coordination mechanism. Furthermore, share China's regulatory experience, production processes and quality control standards for artemisinin drugs, help enhance local self-sufficiency in antimalarial medicines, and build a multi-party resource cooperation platform for governments, medical institutions, enterprises and others, thereby promoting the alignment of Chinese and foreign artemisinin industries, helping Chinese enterprises expand into international markets, and improving the accessibility of medicines in malaria-endemic areas.

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About the Organizer	<p>Founded in 1987, Hunan Children's Hospital serves as the National Regional Medical Center for Children and is affiliated with Xiangya School of Medicine, Central South University. It is a comprehensive, tertiary Grade-A specialized children's hospital integrating medical services, teaching, scientific research, rehabilitation, and disease prevention. Situated on a 50-acre campus, the hospital has 1,800 approved beds and employs over 2,000 staff members. It boasts strong academic disciplines, including 11 National Clinical Key Specialties and 15 Provincial Clinical Key Specialties. The hospital hosts 1 National Science and Technology Innovation Platform (cultivation project), 2 Provincial Key Laboratories, 10 Provincial Clinical Research Centers, and 14 Provincial Clinical Diagnosis and Treatment Centers. It also operates a Postdoctoral Research Workstation. As the first medical institution in Hunan Province certified with the ISO9001/14001 international quality and environmental management system, the hospital has won the Soong Ching Ling Award for Pediatric Medicine four times.</p> <p>The hospital is recognized by the National Health Commission and UNICEF as one of the first "Belt and Road Health Training Demonstration Bases". It is designated as the "Key International Pediatric Medical Center" by the Hunan Provincial Health Commission and acknowledged as both an "International Science and Technology Cooperation Base" and an "Academician Expert Workstation" by the Hunan Provincial Department of Science and Technology. In 2025, the hospital gained two new national-level international cooperation platforms: it was appointed the "Pediatric Development Lead Unit of the China-Africa Hospital Alliance" and successfully selected as one of the first "Chinese Members of the China-ASEAN Maternal and Child Health Cooperation Center", marking its leading role in international pediatric cooperation.</p> <p>Since 2006, the hospital has hosted 138 foreign aid training programs, cultivating over 4,000 medical management and technical talents from more than 110 countries and regions. Its training scale and quality enjoy a high reputation in the industry, with training satisfaction consistently maintained above 98%. The hospital has maintained a clean record regarding foreign affairs safety, handling all emergencies promptly and effectively. Training themes cover over 10 professional fields, including pediatric critical care, neonatology, pediatric nursing, maternal and child health, laboratory technology, traditional Chinese medicine, and hospital management. Instructional languages cover six UN working languages (English, French, Portuguese, Mongolian, Arabic, Russian) and key regional languages along the Belt and Road. Notably, the hospital has successfully held four sessions of the "Libya Pediatric Medical Technology Training Course", training over 100 medical backbones for Libya. Participants generally praised the practical curriculum, professional instructors, and valuable clinical practice, earning high recognition from the Libyan government.</p> <p>In 2018, actively responding to the Belt and Road Initiative and serving the national diplomatic strategy, Hunan Children's Hospital initiated the "Global Pediatric Alliance for Developing Countries" in collaboration with 卫生 (health) departments from Cambodia, Sierra Leone, Zanzibar, and other developing nations, along with top-tier domestic and international children's hospitals and public health institutions. Guided by the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Alliance aligns deeply with the WHO's "Universal Health Coverage" strategy and UNICEF's global child health initiatives to improve pediatric services in developing countries.</p>	

	<p>To date, the Alliance has attracted over 20 medical institutions from 12 countries, including Sierra Leone, Cambodia, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, and Laos. Functioning as a vital follow-up platform for foreign aid training, the Alliance establishes long-term communication mechanisms to consolidate training outcomes and deepen cooperation. It focuses on promoting "Five Sharings": technical sharing, joint disease prevention, talent cultivation, scientific research collaboration, and industrial win-win cooperation. To date, the Alliance has successfully hosted eight "International Forums on Child Health in Developing Countries", inviting over 20 ministerial-level officials and thousands of medical experts. Alumni from foreign aid training programs widely participate in these academic exchanges, maintaining close communication with Chinese experts and forming a virtuous cycle of "Training - Connection - Cooperation - Deepening."</p>
<p>Training content</p>	<p>1. Classroom Instruction & Case Studies: Centered on the core needs of improving breastfeeding rates and preventing malnutrition in infants and young children in developing countries, this seminar adopts an in-depth teaching model that combines theoretical lectures with clinical case discussions. It systematically constructs a full-chain knowledge system ranging from policy advocacy to clinical practice. At the management strategy level, the curriculum focuses on long-term mechanisms for managing Baby-Friendly Hospitals, establishing breastfeeding counseling techniques and support systems. It also analyzes the construction of infant nutrition monitoring networks linking hospitals, communities, and families, as well as nutrition support and feeding management standards for special groups such as premature and low-birth-weight infants. Regarding clinical techniques, specialized courses on infant nutrition assessment and standards for physical growth monitoring are offered. Combined with simulation training, the program strengthens medical personnel's counseling abilities for breastfeeding difficulties (e.g., nipple confusion, insufficient lactation) and their comprehensive management skills for common childhood nutritional diseases (e.g., nutritional anemia, Vitamin D deficiency rickets, protein-energy malnutrition, and childhood obesity). In accordance with the latest guidelines from China and the World Health Organization (WHO), the course provides detailed explanations on complementary feeding and preparation, prevention and management of food allergies, and the formulation of dietary therapy plans based on local resources. This helps trainees master scientific pathways for nutrition screening, diagnosis, and intervention. Furthermore, the curriculum integrates modules on "Internet+" remote breastfeeding guidance technology and grassroots research capability building. Through training in data analysis and project evaluation methods, it enhances trainees' project management and academic thinking capabilities, comprehensively promoting the nutrition guidance level and child health service quality of grassroots medical personnel in developing countries, and further deepening exchanges and cooperation in the global field of maternal and child health.</p> <p>2. Professional Practice and Site Visits: To enhance trainees' practical abilities and provide an intuitive understanding of advanced service systems, this seminar has arranged systematic clinical clerkships and field visits. Clinical clerkships will be conducted directly in core departments of Hunan Children's Hospital, including Neonatology, Child Health Care, Obstetrics, and the Breastfeeding Counseling Clinic. Trainees will participate in breastfeeding clinic consultations, hands-on practice of Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) for premature infants, infant nutrition and dietary analysis, and growth and development assessments, thereby strengthening their grasp of nutrition management for high-risk infants and family parenting guidance. Simultaneously, trainees will be organized to visit the Hunan Provincial Maternal and Child Health Care Hospital and typical community health service centers in Changsha for thematic inspections, exchanging experiences on the implementation of infant nutrition improvement projects under the "integration of medical care and prevention" model. Additionally, the seminar includes a dedicated out-of-province study tour (e.g., to Shenzhen or Shanghai) to visit renowned domestic maternal and child health institutions or nutrition and health enterprises. This allows trainees to learn innovative practices in infant nutrition product R&D, food safety management, and health education communication, effectively broadening their cutting-edge horizons and practical translation capabilities.</p> <p>3. Cultural Experience:</p>

To enhance trainees' understanding of Chinese culture and the humanistic spirit of Hunan, the seminar features a dedicated cultural experience module that deeply integrates traditional Chinese culture with local Hunan characteristics. Trainees will visit the Millennium Academy Yuelu Academy to comprehend the essence of Hunan's "Seeking Truth from Facts" culture and its educational heritage. Through these rich and colorful cultural exchanges, trainees will not only relax physically and mentally but also deepen their multi-dimensional understanding of China's social development, further solidifying the humanistic foundation for friendship and health cooperation between the peoples of China and other nations.
